1. Peggy – Report for admitting FTF – why there were so many this time.

If enrolled and earned one credit or more after high school graduation are no longer considered first time freshmen. From Michael Worth – **Functional definition:**

A student entering UA for the first time but known to have previously **attended** a postsecondary institution at the same level (e.g., undergraduate, graduate). The student may transfer with **or without** credit. This includes exchange students and students with military transcripts showing college credits earned as a result of military experience or training (Airforce transcripts are accredited; Army transcripts are not).

Ph. D. students needed to have an attribute added – UAA was unaware. Peggy will respond to Mike Campbell regarding process and how to make it clear.

2. Jennifer H. – Discuss CHAK and international students – with Student Accounts included.

-The way they wrote the policy international students can be included. However, this can pose an issue with the mandatory insurance policy at UAF as it takes it off.

What is the best way to move forward- if the residence code is an 'I' you cannot use the CHAK fee assessment rate code. Currently, the residence code of 'N' with CHAK, perhaps it could add 'I' with CHAK. Pat thinks it could work; Charlene asked if we had examples;

Amanda and Mark mentioned that it could be added to all of the Student Fee Assessment Rate codes: F1, J1, CAF1, CAJ1 (these all have additional rules tied to them which are lost if CHAK is used)

Is it possible to have just one code? –they are not sure if it is possible;

It was suggested we include International Student Work team – Peggy will take it to Karin (the team lead). And will report back to the Admissions Team.

There was a suggestion to create additional fee codes: CHAF – F1 students, CHAJ – J1 students added to the current CHAK – domestic.

Mike Smith – where is memo or email stating we must allow international students; Mike thinks this should be revisited. It seems like they are not looking at the surcharge but as a residency issue.

Mary cannot share the General Counsel email, but read from the email. However, Mary asked General Counsel for a clarification, but with the same result – International Students can be eligible for CHAK.

Mary will ask for an email that can be shared.

Mike will work with the current residency form to reflect this update.

Jennifer mentioned the DACA students to the International Work Team and the possibility of adding a new code- the work team did not want them coded.
