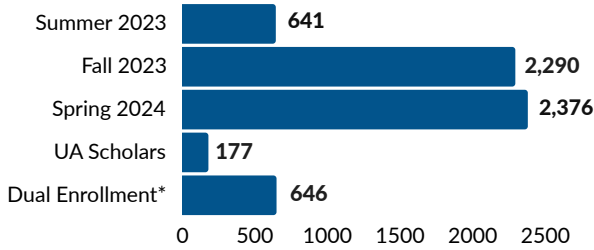

## TRANSFORMING EDUCATION TO CAREER OUTCOMES

A year after graduating, UAF CTC program graduates (FY17 - FY21) were earning an average of \$40,990 annually, about 29 percent (\$9,284) more than they did one year before earning the certificate or degree. Program graduates (FY13 - FY17) working for 5 years were making 39 percent (\$16,063) higher wages on average than graduates who had only been working one year, showing that the earnings boost from a UAF CTC credential increases over time.

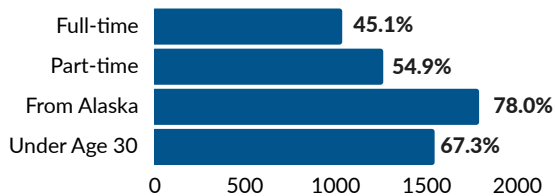

## ENROLLMENT PROFILE

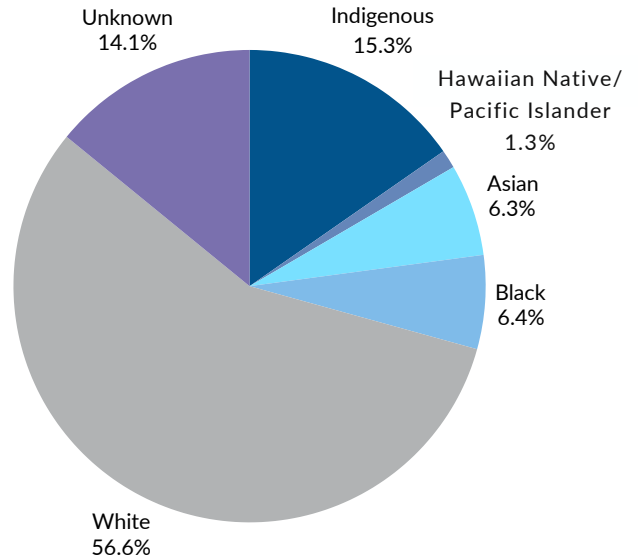
