Provides care to Native and rural students, to support academic success and to assist with the transition to college




Alaska Native Science & Engineering Program

Updates

STUDENTS

Alaska Native Students graduated with 28 certificates, 53 associate degrees, 57 bachelor degrees,
 13 master degrees and 3 doctoral degrees during the 2021-22 academic year

FACULTY & STAFF

- Alaska Native Business Management hired a tenure-track Faculty member
- Alaska Native Studies promoted 2 Alaska Native term Faculty to tenure-track Faculty
- ANSEP has 1 Grow Our Own PhD starting as tenure-track Faculty in engineering in 2023-24 and hired 3 Indigenous Director Staff
- Alaska Native Art term Faculty member hired for Spring 2023-Fall 2024
- Native Student Services hired a new staff member
- RRANN hired a new Director and a Student Success Coordinator

INSTITUTION

- All Colleges, Campuses and Divisions are developing, implementing and assessing unit-level ANSI plans
- Included ANSI into the 10-year Facilities Master Plan
- Reopened the Alaska Native Art Studio
- Projection of land acknowledgement onto buildings
- Rasmuson Foundation grant to develop conceptual design for an Alaska Native Gathering Place

Priorities

- Expansion of Indigenous and rural student serving programs and places
- Recruit and hire Indigenous staff with a goal of employing a UAF workforce that reflects Alaska's population (approximately 20% Alaska Native/American Indian)
- Set a priority of recruiting, retaining and promoting successful tenure and promotion of Indigenous faculty that reflects Alaska's population
- Launch a campaign to increase Indigenous visual representation across UAF campuses including signage and art
- Become a leader in Post-Secondary Indigenization Initiatives

• Alaska Native students graduated with 11 occupational endorsements, 10 certificates, 28 associate degrees, 55 baccalaureate & 8 master degrees during the 2021-22 academic year

- Successful recruitments of faculty in Rural Development, Indigenous Studies, Tribal Governance & Alaska Native Languages
- Geophysical Institute hired an Indigenous Engagement Coordinator
- International Arctic Research Center hired a Diversity & Inclusivity Coordinator

Preparing Indigenous Teachers & Administrators for Alaska Schools (PITAAS)

Continues to be an attractive scholarship opportunity for students entering or advancing in the field of education. PITAAS graduates increased to 230 degrees, certificates and five superintendent endorsements in Fall 2022. Graduates are employed in 26 of Alaska's 54 school districts.

STUDENTS

• UAS Alaska Native student enrollment continues to be above 20% and represented across disciplines.

STAFF & FACULTY

- Currently, there are 27 positions actively being recruited which provide an opportunity for Alaska Native hire. These include, but are not limited to Chancellor, Dean of the School of Education and Northwest Coast Arts.
- Of note, a hiring committee is underway to fill the position of Alaska Native Success Coordinator.

INSTITUTION

- UAS partners with Southeast Alaska Native organizations and tribes in developing opportunities for Alaska Native hire, student engagement and course and degree development. Northwest Coast Arts and Cultures academic options continues to expand and is celebrated across the campuses of Ketchikan, Sitka and Juneau.
- The ANSI plan is embedded in the UAS Facilities Master Plan, Student Recruitment and Retention Plans, accreditation planning, and by Department and Schools.

LARGEST ANSEP ENROLLMENT

The Alaska Native Science & Engineering

Program (ANSEP) expanded the Acceleration

Academy to Kotzebue, and a statewide

residential opportunity, welcoming nearly 150

NEXT PHASE FOR TROTH YEDDHA'

The Troth Yeddha' Indigenous Studies Center (TYISC) is now in the design phase. The architect for the National Museum of the American Indian, is designing the TYISC, and is led by creating a place of belonging for generations of students.



INDIGENOUS LANGUAGE SUPPORT FROM SEALASKA

Sealaska Heritage Institute will fund UAS students taking courses in Xaad Kíl, Sm'algyax and Lingít, and teachers to provide free, non-credit language courses. Funding will be available Spring 2023 through Spring 2025.
