## REGENTS' POLICY PART X – ACADEMIC POLICY

## Chapter 10.03 - Degree, Certificate and Award Approval

#### P10.03.010. Degree and Certificate Candidate and Recipient Approval.

- A. Candidates for degrees and certificates approved by the board will be recommended by the faculties and academic deans, certified by the registrars as having met all applicable requirements for the degree or certificate, and endorsed by the respective chancellor and by the president. All degrees and certificates are conferred by the board.
- B. The official lists of degree and certificate recipients will be established by the chancellors immediately after the official closing date of each term. The combined lists for the spring and preceding fall and summer terms will be transmitted by the president to the board after the spring session. This official list of degree and certificate recipients will be presented to the board for their approval at the next regularly scheduled meeting.

#### P10.03.020. Honorary Degrees and Meritorious Service Awards Approval and Criteria.

- A. The board will approve individuals to receive honorary degrees and meritorious service awards and confer these degrees and awards.
- B. The principal criterion for individuals to receive an honorary degree from the university will be evidence of a significant and lasting contribution to the university, the State of Alaska, or to the individual's discipline or profession.
- C. The principal criterion for individuals to receive a meritorious service award from the university will be outstanding service by individuals within the state to a local campus, extension service, or community.

## UNIVERSITY REGULATION PART X – ACADEMIC POLICY

#### Chapter 10.03 - Degree, Certificate and Award Approval

#### R10.03.020. Honorary Degrees and Meritorious Awards Approval and Criteria.

#### A. Awards

Honorary degrees and meritorious service awards may be conferred as university campus awards or University of Alaska awards upon approval of the Board of Regents.

#### B. Procedures for Nomination, Approval and Conferment

Nominations for honorary degree or meritorious service award candidates may be made by members of the Board of Regents, campus advisory councils, members of the university community, or citizens of the state.

## 1. University Campus Honorary Degrees and Meritorious Service Awards

Nominations for University campus honorary degrees and meritorious service awards must be submitted to the appropriate Chancellor for review by a faculty committee. In order to afford members of the Board of Regents an opportunity to attend committee meetings if they wish, Chancellors will notify the Regents Affairs Officer of committee meeting schedules.

The committee's recommendations will be forwarded through the Chancellor and the President, for their consideration and recommendation, to the Board of Regents. Nominations must be accompanied by substantive documentation which focuses on how the nominees meet the Regents' Policy criteria for a degree or award.

The Board of Regents will act upon nominations for award at spring commencement at the first meeting of the Board in the preceding fall semester. Under exceptional circumstances the Board will consider nominations submitted at other times.

Honorary degrees and meritorious service awards will not be awarded in absentia. While commencement will be the usual ceremony at which awards are to be conferred, other occasions may be substituted upon approval by the Board of Regents.

In order to accommodate arrangements necessary to invite commencement speakers upon whom an honorary degree is to be conferred, or awardees who cannot immediately attend a commencement, nominations may be approved up to four years prior to the actual award.

Ordinarily a meritorious service award will be conferred within the academic year in which it is approved. A Chancellor may request from the Regents postponement to the following year.

Announcement of honorary degree and meritorious service award recipients prior to the award ceremony will be at a time determined by the appropriate Chancellor.

2. University of Alaska Honorary Degrees and Meritorious Service Awards

Nominations for award by the University of Alaska must be presented to the President, who will forward them with appropriate substantive documentation to the Board of Regents.

#### C. **Honorary Degrees**

Nominations will include a brief statement of the following information on each candidate:

- 1. name and pertinent personal information;
- education (degrees received); 2.
- 3. contributions to the University, and/or the state, or the nominee's discipline or profession; and
- 4. rationale for recommendation for honorary degree.

The type of honorary degree to be awarded should be one of the following:

Doctor of Laws (LL.D.)	for persons distinguished in general service to the state, to learning, and to humankind.
Doctor of Letters (Litt.D.)	for persons distinguished in scholarly work of a somewhat restricted nature; usually conferred upon scholars in particular disciplines.
Doctor of Science (Sc.D.)	for persons who have made distinguished contribution and performed services in the sciences.
Doctor of Humane Letters (L.H.D.)	for persons who have distinguished themselves in the humanities.
