### University of Alaska Fairbanks' Mission Statement

The University of Alaska Fairbanks, the nation's northernmost Land, Sea and Space Grant university and international research center, advances and disseminates knowledge through teaching, research and public service with an emphasis on Alaska, the circumpolar North and their diverse peoples. The new accreditation process being implemented by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities requires each institution that is seeking re-accreditation to identify core themes. The indicators are data that the university will collect and present as evidence that it is fulfilling its mission. Below are the themes and objectives that the administration, faculty, and staff of UAF have chosen.

- Exhibit, perform and publish creative works.
- Engage graduate and baccalaureate students in research, scholarship and creative activity.
- ❖ Demonstrate leadership in research and artistic expression.

#### Prepare: Alaska's Career, Technical and Professional Workforce

- Prepare students for jobs in Alaska.
- Provide Alaskans opportunities to update their job skills.
- Help prepare secondary students for post secondary career pathways.

- Partner with Alaska communities on issues of mutual interest.
- Provide higher education access for Alaska Native and rural populations.
- Engage students in learning about Alaska Native languages and cultures, and rural development.
