	Materials. Be clear about materials. For example, don't just say students need paper.
	What kind of paper? Lined, graph, colored paper, etc. Be specific.
	Alignment to relevant learning standards. (State or National). The lesson should be
	aimed at a specific learning standard for the subject. Include what standard the lesson is
	aligned to.
	Description of practice activities. Describe what will be done and how the lesson will
	flow.
	Desired outcomes of the lesson. Describe what the students will be able to do, or demonstrate at the end of this lesson.
	Method of assessing if outcomes were achieved. Don't simple say "ask questions". Be
	specific.
