Carla Beam and Chris Christiansen -

State in third year deficit 1 billion first year, 2 billion second year, expect 1.4 billion this year. Oil price in decline. 3.5 billion deficit expected over all....state budget it 6 billion right now. Constitution budget reserve and state budget reserve are two savings account - \$15 billion total...savings should've lasted till 2022...they are expecting the savings accounts to be empty in 3 years. Taxes or cutting PFD may be the on the table or just cut. 5% agency cuts. 8% on the table and it may not be enough.

Advice from state OMB is for UA to do the 5 to 8 percent cut like the other agencies. Ongoing cuts are likely for the next 3 to 5 years. Strengthening the core is the focus as cuts are made.

Not a good approach to go to Juneau and push for programs. Looking for agencies to use the university as a resource. Bottom line....cuts need to be made...the university needs to make this decision and not lawmakers.

Federal education tax credit is a concern with faculty...contributed \$40 million in the last 3 years to the university

Karl said this was to be the high level executive group to make IT decisions and has gone to various leaders. In the summer, 2014 vice chancellor spindle encouraged to attenda a summit in Chicago, and from that they are trying to set a new direction for OIT. 10.2 Mobile device policy – Karl Kowalski

CIO group meets regularly and identified the proliferation of mobile devices with faculty, staff and students. Audit on IT will happen in the fall. Increase of cloud usage caused them to look at what other universities do – policy and regs. The policy is simple and states we are responsible for the security of mobile devices even down to flash drive. The real meat is the regulation that comes out of the policy. Some things to be in regs: protection of non-public information, requirements for promoting loss or theft (password protected to be sure data is not compromised), how to secure the device (incryption, password), requirements when traveling overseas. Clean laptops to use with no data for use in meetings etc. OIT will help guide individuals to be sure the devices are secure.

What's the level of liability for the individual? Karl says that will be left to counsel, but it will be for individuals to get a password, encrypt the drive, etc. and if not, there would be a disciplinary process.

There's training in skilsoft for mobile devices. UAF has training on this subject as well.
