

Tuition and Fees by State: Public Four-Year In-State









Value of a UA Education – Bachelors Degree

- 4 years of UA annual cost: \$8940 x 4 = \$35,760. Add 5 years of opportunity cost of \$33,815* x 5 = \$169,075
- Total cost of 4-year college degree:
 \$204,835
- * U.S. Census's American Community Survey



Value of a UA Education – Associate Degree

- 2 years of UA annual cost: \$8940 x 2 = \$17,880. Add 3 years of opportunity cost of \$33,815* x 3 = \$101,445
- Total cost of 3-year college degree:
 \$119,325


Mercatus Center study

Dated ('06) but study being redone

- For AK, cost of college breakeven point = 8
 years from start of college
- 42% higher average earnings for college degree
- 62% higher earnings growth rate
- 25% higher likelihood of employment
- Net value (2002) over lifetime of earnings was \$2.3M
- Net rate of return for AK 22.5%



Discounted Tuition & Fees Private vs Public Colleges




Discounted tuition and fees in current dollars for private and public colleges

Marginal Net Present Value





Average annual wages by occupation, gender, and highest education level (FY 2015)











Delving Deeper into the Data.

The committee is disaggregating the results by different sub-populations. This approach allows UAA to see where it might have pockets of success with defined groups and explore potential reasons why. It also allows the committee to pinpoint specific actions that might help to improve results.

- Residence hall status;
- Distance education status;
- Enrollment status (full- and part-time students);
- First generation status;,
- General demographics (race/ethnicity, gender);
- Students with As, Bs, or Cs and below grades.

This work has been completed and will be reviewed by the committee at its October 25 meeting.








National Survey of Student Engagement UAF 2016 Results

Seniors' perceived gains: Percentage responding "Very Much" or "Quite a Bit"








National Survey of Student Engagement UAF 2016 Results

Value of a UA College Education

- UA is a good value when compared nationally.
- Fewer than half of UA students take on debt.
 For those who do, Bachelor's students average
 <\$30k, Associates <\$20k.
- Based on the college scorecard, UA costs less, salaries are higher, and debt is paid off at a higher rate than national averages.
- College has a high rate of return.
- From a purely financial perspective, not all degrees have the same rate of return.
- There are many values to a college education that are not financial.
