Summary: Graduation Rates

Graduation rates in UA's four-year programs are still above the national average for public open admission institutions, although dropping slightly from all-time high levels observed in FY21. The FY23 graduation rate for first-time, full-time freshman seeking any undergraduate degree was 36.6 percent, representing an increase of about 16 percent over the FY16 rate of 31.5 percent (Table 202a).

Graduation rates in UA's two-year or shorter programs have grown considerably in recent years. The proportion of first-time, full-time freshman who pursued and earned a degree 2-years or less in length within 3 years grew significantly over the last seven years - from less than 17 percent in FY16 to an all-time high of almost 29 percent in FY23 – representing an increase of more than 70 percent (Table 2.02b). The proportion of indigenous first-time, full-time freshman who pursued and earned a degree 2-years or less in length within 3 years has increased 116 percent since FY16, reaching an all-time high of almost 19 percent in FY23 (Table 2.02b1).

Students receiving the UA Scholars award have higher graduation rates than other student aid recipient groups. First-time, full-time UA scholars seeking a bachelor's degree, and earning any undergraduate degree, graduate at a higher rate than any other group of students. Examining just the last three fiscal years, FY23, FY22, and FY21, 58 percent, 64.3 percent, and 63.9 percent of students earned any undergraduate degree in six years (Table 202a). Comparatively, the overall graduation rates for UA students were 38.4 percent in FY23, 42 percent in FY22 and 45.6 percent in FY21 (Table 202c).

Compared to similar institutions nationally, UA students are more likely to graduate. The national six-year baccalaureate graduation rate for students enrolling at public, four-year, open admission institutions was 28.6 percent in FY20. The rate for UA students at that time was about 36.9 percent, nearly 29 percent higher than the national rate (Table 2.02a). The most recent published national six-year baccalaureate graduation rate of indigenous, degree-seeking students enrolling at public, four-year, open admission institutions was 15.5 percent in FY20. For indigenous students attending UA, 18.8 percent of those pursuing a bachelor's degree graduated within six years (FY20), about 21 percent higher than the national average at similar institutions (Table 2.02a1).
