Summary: UA Scholars Award Recipients

The UA Scholars program is a four-year scholarship funded solely by the University of Alaska through its land endowment. This program was designed to help reduce the number of top Alaska high school graduates who leave the state for higher education. The program provides partial payment of tuition and fees at any UA campus. For a student attending full-time, the UA Scholars award totals \$12,000 distributed as \$1,500 payments per semester for eight semesters. To maintain eligibility, a student must maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA and complete at least 30 credits during the first year and at least 24 credits per year thereafter.

In fall 2023, 294 new UA Scholars enrolled in the UA System, representing about 30 percent of the eligible top 10 percent of Alaska high school graduates, (Table 1.27b). Since the program began in fall 1999, a cumulative total of 10,453 UA Scholars have attended UA (Table 1.27a).

A total of 1,404 UA Scholars enrolled in fall 2023 (Table 1.28). Most of this group was seeking a bachelor's degree (1,013; 72 percent). About 14 percent were attending as non-degree seekers (199) and 10 percent (133) were pursuing a 2-year or shorter program. The remaining students were pursuing graduate level programs. (Table 1.30).


Four program areas accounted for half of all UA Scholar majors in fall 2023: Health (191 students, 14 percent); Business and Public Administration (180 students, 13 percent); Engineering (163 students, 12 percent); and Math, Physical and Life Sciences (162 students, 12 percent) (Table 1.31a).

The top major for UA Scholars was Nursing/Pre-major Nursing (91 students) at UA Anchorage, Biological Sciences (69 students) at UA Fairbanks and Elementary Education (9 students) at UA Southeast (Table 1.31b).

Since the UA Scholar program began in fall 1999, a cumulative total of over 10,000 students have enrolled and received a UA Scholar distribution from the University of Alaska through fall semester 2023. This illustrates the overall impact this program has had on Alaska and its residents.

Note: The UA Scholars Award is a four-year scholarship, totaling \$12,000, awarded to the top 10 percent of graduating seniors from qualified Alaska high schools who enroll anywhere in the University of Alaska system. Effective beginning in fall 2015, the total UA Scholars award increased from \$11,000 to \$12,000. 'New' includes any UA Scholar who received a UA Scholar distribution for the first time in the reported term. 'Cumulative' is the sum of all paid UA Scholars from previous terms through the reported term.
