Educators Rising Alaska

for students and educators alike. The EdRising AK CTE Education pathway offers four courses, along with a

UAS ED dual enrollment and a direct-led UAS course intended for rural students. Middle school curriculum is also now available.

CTSO student officer opportunities enable students to assist with state leadership conference planning, connect students across the state, and develop leadership skills.

Professional development, designed for current educators, is offered yearly. They meet monthly to discuss current topics in education and to help grow their EdRising AK chapters and to bolster their EdRising AK courses.

Office works with Alaska's public

Alaska through recruitment and support of incoming teachers as they apply for jobs and transfer certification to the state of Alaska. We are a service member organization, and districts choose the level of service their district needs for each year. Our services include:

- A state-wide application system and job bank for all school related jobs,
- Providing technical support for our job bank and application system.
- Hosting virtual job fairs for school districts
- Promoting teaching in Alaska through our social

media platforms

- A long term substitute list for the state
- Recruiting at colleges and universities across the United States
- Attending job fairs across the United States.



Place-based curriculum boosts student achievement and improves academic, social, and emotional learning. Students learn to solve local challenges by understanding where they live

and taking action in their communities. Place-based education energizes teachers and helps to connect schools to their communities.

Our place-based STEM programs partner with rural and urban school districts, supporting over 2,000 students, and have developed hundreds of culturally relevant hands-on lessons and activities.

We bring scientists, Cultural Knowledge Bearers and industry experts into classrooms all across Alaska. Teacher Ambassadors Sharing Knowledge (TASK) is our most recent place-based program. TASK supports Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian students by incorporating Indigenous language and culture in STEM instruction, providing professional development workshops for teachers, and offering cultural exchange opportunities for students and teachers.
