Discontinuation of the Career and Technical Education Graduate Certificate

Attached is the Program Action Request (PAR) form seeking Board of Regents Action to discontinue the Career and Technical Education Graduate Certificate. Also attached is the UAA letter to the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) dated August 21, 2014 informing the NWCCU of the suspension of admissions to the program.

Admissions to the Graduate Certificate were suspended in 2014 for further review as a result of cyclical Program Review; this ultimately led to planned deletion due to lack of interest. Consistent with UAA's suspension guidelines, a teach out has been completed and no students remain in the program. There are no resources or faculty tied to the program. There are no other impacts on programs or stakeholders.
