A year after graduating, Anchorage 2-year degree program and certificate graduates (FY17 - FY21) were earning an average of \$44,314 annually, about 52 percent (\$15,079) more than they did one year before earning the certificate or degree. The graduates (FY13 - FY17) working for 5 years were making 33 percent (\$14,673) higher wages on average than graduates who had only been working one year, showing that the earnings boost from a UAA Anchorage campus credential increases over time.





ENROLLMENT PROFILE


Students enrolled in 2-year degree and certificate programs at UAA Anchorage Campus
