


# **SITKA CAMPUS**

UAS Sitka aims to provide a place where everyone can enrich their lives and build a path to their future. The campus specializes in distance-learning opportunities to increase accessibility to meet students where they are.

SUPPORT (Strengthening Unique Potential for Progress through Opportunities, Relationships, and Transitions) is a Title III grant on the Sitka Campus designed to better serve and support historically underserved student populations.

- Goal 1: Strengthen the way UAS Sitka builds and manages meaningful relationships between staff/faculty and students, especially nontraditional, first-generation, and undersupported students.

#### **HELPING STUDENTS REACH THEIR GOALS**

**1,256** Students took at least one for-credit course

25 Students took at least one non-credit course

A year after graduating, UAS Sitka program graduates (FY17 - FY21) were earning an average of \$40,640 annually, about 37 percent (\$14,851) more than they did one year before earning the certificate or degree. Program graduates (FY13 - FY17) working for 5 years were making 12 percent (\$6,730) higher wages on average than graduates who had only been working one year, showing that the earnings boost from a UAS Sitka credential increases over time.





## **ENROLLMENT PROFILE**



#### Sitka Start
